FALA's Curriculum Philosophy

Our curriculum emphasizes the visual and performing arts and prepares students to think critically, communicate effectively, analyze issues, and develop leadership abilities through:

- Rigorous academic courses premised on high expectations and sequenced to prepare students for college success.
- Enrollment in arts classes for all students to support and encourage self-expression, creativity and awareness. All FALA students are required a minimum of one course within each artistic discipline— theater, dance, art and music.
- Civic participation through our service learning program, which connects course curricula with local and global social issues through service experiences in the community. Our emphasis is on organizations that work for social change.
- The development of leadership skills which encourages students to mentor, reflect on their experiences, set short- and long-term goals.
